

November 7, 1944

Meyer opened.

Minutes read and approved.

Rabb gave the report on the Chess Club. Tuckman suggested to Rabb that the Board write to Purdue to arrange a match on the day of the Purdue game. The consensus of the Board was favorable to this action.

Meyer discussed absenteeism and its consequences for the Union Board. Shuser, Radigan, Kaminski, and Oswald were absent from this meeting.

Lyman gave the Social Committee report. There was a \$350 loss on the formal season opener. There will be a Bridge and Record Dance Friday night at 30¢ per person which will cater to dateless women.

Meyer suggested a Sadie Hawkins Dance, indicating its popularity at the University of Kentucky. The Board then discussed the pseudo-sophistication of the students at Indiana and the artificial formality that characterizes our dances.

Zuhl brought up the question of the high cost of corsages in Bloomington. The Board resolved to bring the matter to the attention of the Social Affairs Committee.

Lyman said that the night of December 30 is being held open for a Union-AWS New Year's dance.

It appears that the scheduled Grid-graph will interfere with the decorating for the Flame-Pamarada Dance. Lyman will investigate the possibility of broadcasting to the Commons from the Sigma Delta Chi room and Meyer will get the men to do the broadcasting, the information to be taken from a Western Union wire.

Willis moved to adjourn. Zuhl 2nd. Carried.
