Committee Reports:

Social--Jones reporting: A \$5.00 profit was realized on the dance Friday night; 158 people attended--A record dance.

Pep Sessions--Thompson reporting: Students will meet at 4 p.m. Friday for a pep session in front of the Union. At this time the card display will be explained. After a few cheers the crowd will move to the stadium to meet Bo and the team and have more cheers. Thompson conducted a meeting with Housing Representatives to discuss the time of pep sessions, the programs for the pep sessions, and the card display. 1000 red and white cards have been stapled together and numbered according to seats. There will be 7 different formations used during the game. There will be a Quarter-Back Hour at 7:30 Wednesday, October 24 of the Iowa Game. Bo will narrate.

Social--Jones reporting: On Friday, October 26 Fred Cizek will play for a dance. A sub-committee of 12 members has planned the dance, and it is to be known as the "Witches' Whirl".

Record Hour--Murray reporting: Record Hour last Friday night was well attended--75 to 100 people.

Chess--Murray reporting: An announcement has been placed in the STUDENT asking for applications for a Chess Team to meet a team from Purdue the morning of the I.U.-Purdue football game.

Town Hall--Weber reporting: Town Hall Council seems to be a success. It is composed of 20 members. Joan Scott was elected Chairman. They will hold another meeting Nov. 4. The Town Hall last Sunday night was attended by 45 people; Lindley Smith was the moderator. It was the recommendation of the Council that Housing Units be

consulted on the choice of subjects for Town Hall discussions by means of a questionnaire. The question arose in the Council if the Union Board still has the final say on the subjects to be used in the discussions. The Union Board decided that it should maintain a silent control over the topics since the discussions were still under the sponsorship of the Union Board.

Any member of this sub-comm. will be admitted for tax after selling 15 tickets. Union Board members will be admitted for tax after selling 5 tickets. The Union-AWS Comm. has received numerous complaints about the closed Friday nights.

Pep Sessions--Thompson reporting: The pep session Friday Oct. 26 attended by about 100 people. The Cheering Block used three formations at the Tulsa game which were reported very satisfactory. About 600 people attended the Quarter-Back Hour Oct. 24.

Town Hall--Weber reporting: Town Hall will discuss "Visual Education" Sunday, Nov. 4. Discussion was had on building up the popularity of the Town Hall Series. It was the recommendation of the Board that the Council choose subjects which will prove more interesting to the students.

Discussion was had on the advisability of keeping Friday nights closed for Union-AWS dances. Hunter moved that Friday nights remain closed for Union-AWS dances. Jones seconded. Motion carried.

It was decided by the Board that Dean Bates be invited to serve as faculty advisor for the Union Board. Kyle appointed Thompson, Jones, and Rockefeller to formally present the invitation to Dean Bates.
