 Minutes read and approved

Mr Smith presided at the Formal Induction of Stan Steckler, Ed Duncan, and Harry Griggs. Mr. Smith instructed the new men in the duties of the members of the Union Board.

Committee Reports:

Social--Jones reporting: A \$70.00 net loss was suffered on the dance Nov. 2; 100 couples attended. The Orin Tucker Dance will be held from 9 to 1. Board members must sell 5 tickets to be admitted for tax. Anyone selling 15 tickets will be admitted for tax. Life members of the Union will be admitted for tax after selling 5 tickets. The issue of closed Friday nights was turned over to the Social Affairs Committee.

Pep Sessions--Thompson reporting: The cards were not used at the Cornell College game due to circumstances beyond our control. The cards will, however, be used at the Purdue game. The Minn. game will be broadcast over the radios in the Union Building. There will be a Quarter-Back Hour for the Minn. game on Nov. 14.

Records and Chess--Murray reporting: About 140 people attended the Record Hour last Friday night. Only four applications for the Chess Team have been received so far.

Town Hall--Weber reporting: There was good publicity on the program "Visual Aids" but only 30 people attended the meeting. There will be a discussion on Nov. 18; the subject has not yet been picked.

Kyle made the following Committee appointments: Records and Billiards, Steckler; Parties and Special Events, Griggs; Chess and Banquets, Duncan.

The Board discussed the Union-AWS Comm. requirement that Board members have to sell 5 tickets to be admitted for tax. It was decided that it was within their jurisdiction and must be complied with.

Mr Smith recommended that the Union Board have a joint meeting with the AWS Council to discuss their mutual problems. The Board voiced their approval.

It was the recommendation of the Board to the Town Hall Council that the time of meetings be changed from Sunday night to either Tuesday afternoon or Thursday evening.

Weber moved that Larry Hundley be accepted as a replacement on the Yell-Leading squad. Jones seconded. Motion carried.

The Board approved a recommendation that the students meet the football team in front of the Gables Sunday evening with a pep session.

Jones reported that Dean Robert Bates would accept the position as Advisor. Thompson moved that Dean Robert Bates be named Faculty Advisor for the Union Board. Weber seconded. Motion carried.

Hunter moved that the meeting be adjourned. Thompson seconded. Motion carried.
