Lyman C. Smith presented Life Membership Certificates to the retiring members of the Board. These men were Rick Lambert, Freeman Hinds, Dick Fague, Glen Graves, Wes Bowers, Dick Hawley, Hugh Husband, Frank Patton, Bob Quear, and King Traub.

The toastmaster, Dixie Heighway, then introduced the 1947-48 President of the Board, Rick Lambert. Lambert, in turn, presented the gavel to the new president for 1948-49, Harry Wallace.

President Emeritus W. L. Bryan addressed members and guests on "Philosophies of Education."

The banquet was then brought to a close by Dixie Heighway who asked that members of the old and new boards convene in the Bryan Room for a joint meeting.

President Wallace announced that the purpose of the meeting was to acquaint the new Board with functions of the office.

Graves requested that inasmuch as committee heads were not yet named, the old members explain their duties in coordination with the Board. Graves started the discussion by urging new board members to turn personnel biweekly reports in on time, to distribute work more evenly among workers, and to report how hours of workers were spent.

Traub suggested the Board give more service such as entertainment to the student body.

Hawley explained the use of files of student entertainers by the Purdue Union and suggested the establishment of such at Indiana.



Patton urged Board members to promote the Union in general.

Toy suggested that the Board keep urging the Athletic Department to reserve seats in the stadium for student body. Toy also asked that the Board start promotional stunts of various kinds such as a best-dressed man and woman contest.

Hinds urged more work on dances.

Quear recommended that work on publications be dispensed with early enough to allow a thorough job to be accomplished.

Husband advised using Town Hall to set up forums of other groups on campus.

Lambert urged that dances should have individual themes which could follow the decorations throughout. Lambert also suggested that members be shifted to various committees throughout the year to acquaint each with different tasks of the Board.

Smith and Lusk explained their positions on the Board and asked for cooperation through out the year.

Bowers suggested using the file on decorations and factors which led to the success of the dances in the Union Building. He also suggested an idea hour to follow the regular meeting to help solve the problems of other members.

Steckel also asked for the revamping of committees with three or four mem per committee.

Hawley suggested a penny carnival to be held in the field house as a special event which could be sponsored by the Union.

Wallace thanked the old Board for their suggestions.

Patton urged that a particular person work in cooperation with the Auditorium.

Wallace then asked new members to hand in letters stating committee desired and reasons for such.

#### New Business

Graves asked members to have personnel reports in by Friday, April 30

Wallace stated that this year the Board would try to promote itself in the housing units and on campus by the help of each individual member.

Baker was instructed to write a letter to Dr. Bryan advising him that the Board would use the motto, "Grant us to know that it is not the beginning, but the continuing of the same until it is thoroughly finished, which yieldeth the true glory", for the inscription above the fireplace in the Bryan Room.

Hawley moved the meeting be adjourned. Bowers seconded. Carried.
