Town Hall: Plans have been made to set up a public opinion research division, with the hopes of taking polls of opinions next year. The Town Hall Forum on May 4 will be based upon the Sophomore Leadership Conference. The last forum of the year on May 18, will deal with the economic conditions of the United States.

Special Party: A party has tentatively been scheduled for May 24. All Union Board men on campus will be invited, along with several special guests.

New Business:

The Senior Class will use the Rhythm Room on the night of the Senior Siwash, and the room will remain open to the public. Letters have been mailed to all seniors

informing them of the activities of Senior Weekend. Bob Schwartz gave a detailed report on the proposed campus radio station. A radio committee of five men was set up. Dick Barger and Joe Dye were appointed to the committee; three other men will be appointed in the near future.

Old Business:

A committee was appointed to study a proposed Union policy concerning the awarding of service hours for men working on special events not sponsored by the Union. The committee is composed of Joe Dye, Alan Graf and Malcolm Witt. Bob Schearer reported the final plans for the Senior Barbeque.

New Business:

The Fall Carnival was discussed and Dave Baker was appointed chairman for 1949. Bill Pickering was appointed assistant chairman. Earl McMahon gave a report on the convention of The National Association of College Unions.
