The awarding of third floor office space was discussed. A committee consisting of Don Tabbert, Dick Barger, Earl Mc Mahon, and the manager of the Union was appointed to study the problem. A discussion on admission tickets to the I.U. carnival was tabled until the next meeting.

Mr. Charles Harrell, of the Registrar's Office, announced that the Y.M.C.A. has discontinued the publishing of the Red Book. The registrar's office will publish a student directory this year. Approximately 2,000 of these directories will be sold to the student body for \$1.00 each. If the Union Board will undertake to establish a sales force made up of its service workers, 10% of the gross income from the sale of the directories will be returned to the Union. The Union will bear no risk of loss. This is not intended as a permanent annual service, but is offered only for the school year 1949-1950.

Motion: The Union Board will undertake the above project for the school year 1949-1950.

Individual and Club Activities: The crafts group will begin its regularly scheduled meetings one week from Thursday. The Bridge Club will be formed this Thursday night.

Music Activities: The Union record player now has a long-playing attachment. Full opera programs will be presented on the first Sunday night of each month.

Personnel: Members of the board were urged to turn in their hours by the fourth of each month. Sixty ushers have been selected for the football and basketball games. All ushers are upperclassmen.
