All of these affairs will be given in the Marine Room. There will be advanced ticket sales for the Union-A.W.S. dance in Alumni Hall on October 28. Free tickets will be given to the sales force on the basis of one free ticket for every ten tickets sold. The Rhythm Room will continue to be open as regularly scheduled. The Union-A.W.S. Social Committee will be composed of 20 students this year. All Union-A.W.S. social functions will stem from this committee.

Student Spirit: Two cheerleaders went to Ohio State and two members of the squad will be present at every football game that is played out of town this year. There will be a pep rally this Thursday.
