The meeting was called to order by the president at 7:00P.M. and the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The following committees reported:

Social: The Christmas Eve on Campus party was a huge success.

Music: A program such as the Summer Show Boat is tentatively being planned for next semester.

Public Relations: A newsletter was sent to former board members on December 15.

Team Activities: There will be no fencing team due to the difficulty of obtaining equipment. The tryouts for the Union Bowling Team have been postponed.

Personnel: Board members were requested to turn in their hours for December by Friday, January 6.

Individual and Club Activities: The final costs to the Union for the Wisconsin winter sports tour is \$26.00. The Outing Club is quickly dying out due to no co-operation from W.R.A. The Union is slowly going ahead with plans for sponsoring a Youth Hostel.

Old Business: The plans for a campus radio station were discussed. The downtown radio stations will not oppose the establishing of the station as long as local advertising is not accepted. The financial sponsoring of the station was discussed in detail. The following men were appointed to the radio finance committee: Dye, chairman, Baker Schwartz and Witt.
