All member finally present

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 by the president and the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The following committees reported:

Social: Next dance will be November 18.

Personall: Hoosier Hall office staff for Fall Carnival has been set up.

Team Activities: Chess Club has 49 members. Bridge had 62 people at the last meeting. Lindy Moss is the supervisor.

Music Activities: The Friday program may be put off the air.

Individual and Club: The Photography Club met last Thursday night and re-elected Russ Swenson to the presidency.

A tentative program of activities for members of the club has been worked out and will be acted upon at the meeting this evening. A field trip is scheduled for Sunday week, October 29 and there will be a shoot night in the near future. The club is also working on plans for a Fall Photography Salon during the latter part of November. Members of the club will take pictures for the Union of the Fall Carnival, as has been done in the past years.

Mike Mims has been appointed by the Union Propaganda committee to handle all publicity for the club.

As of last Thursday, we had approximately 45 paid members.

The Club, through Russ Swenson, has arranged for special reductions on photography paper and flash bulbs with the Wiles Camera Shop on East Kirkwood. Savings will amount to about 25 and 33 1/3 %. This saving will make it possible for members to print and take a considerable larger number of photos than was possible in the past because of the relatively high cost of supplies.

New equipment, amounting to approximately \$60 in value, has been added to the facilities in the darkroom. Among the items added are an easel, a paper cutter, safe-light equipment, roll film developers, a new developer tank, and a timer.

Special classes in methods of processing film have begun for members of the club who are interested in learning more about the various techniques involved.

The Special Projects Committee is working on the scale model of the Union Building but it has temporarily halted. Bill Carlock who was doing the work, has been compelled to drop out of school because of an emergency situation at home and does not expect to return before February at the earliest. Student Spirit: Pep rally was last Friday and approximately 1,500 attended. Coach Smith and C. Clevenger gave pep talks.
