



The seventh meeting of the 1951-52 Union Board was called to order by the President at 7:05 p.m. Bob Weathers was absent.

The following committees reported:

Student Spirit - The first pep session will be Thursday, Sept. 27, 1951, for the Notre Dame game.

Special Events - The Fall Activities Festival will be Friday, September 28, in the ABCD rooms as part of the Union Open House.

Social - The first Rhythm Room show will be Wednesday, Sept. 19. The First Fling dance will be Friday, Sept. 21, in Alumni Hall. A coffee hour with AWS will be Thursday, Sept. 20, at 7:30 p.m. A tour of the building will be made followed by a social hour in the Colonial Tea Room.

Individual and Clubs - Ideas are being collected for future activities.

Town Hall - Topics are being considered for discussion, preferably those concerning campus problems.

Student-Faculty Relations - Panels will be held Friday, September 21, at 3:00 and 4:00 p.m. in Chemistry 209, in conjunction with Orientation Week.

Team Activities - Tom Boone is president of Team Activities Council. Committee chairmen will meet with Mr. Monfort.

Mr. Smith reported that the Big Ten schools have contracted Charley Peterson for a ten week tour of Conference schools to stimulate interest in college billiards. Each school will pay Mr. Peterson \$150.00 per week for his appearances. He will be here at Indiana November 12 through 17.

Personnel - Office supplies are in. The keys for the closet and tower are available for Board members. The typewriter has been repaired and will be locked in the secretary's desk. Keys will be available to Board members. Board members were again requested to turn in a break down of their committees so that the organizational chart can be drawn up. The athletic ushering staff will be selected from applicants this week end. Pauloski and Hreha will meet to determine the number of hours to be given for both stadium and auditorium ushering. A campaign is on for service workers. New forms have been printed for the recording of hours and Board members are to turn in hours every Friday for recording. Persons with skill in writing ads are wanted to do work for the Campus Calendar.

Publicity and Public Relations - The booklet for Freshmen and the new membership cards are both ready for distribution. Arrangements are being made to have the Union Tower open on week ends when the weather is nice and to have guides available for campus tours on week ends when there are activities on campus. The picture of the Board is on display in the Commons showcase. The information desk is in operation for Orientation Week.

Fall Carnival - Wible and Adams have donated a sport coat for the Bachelor of the Year. The third letter with rules and application blanks has gone out to all housing units. Mr. Smith suggested that the Union conduct a raffle at the Carnival with the prize being a dinner date with Carol Mitchell, runner-up in the Miss America contest this year. Representatives from housing units will meet Monday, September 24, at 4:30 p.m. Jerry Baur reported that the meeting with town representatives was not very well attended. There was some discussion as to whether there should actually be a booth sponsored by town groups, since there is an agreement that the town and the University should not conflict with each other in charitable drives. In order that the Carnival remain primarily a student-sponsored affair, Dick Hensel moved that the Union provide a booth for some stunt or activity to be run by dignitaries from town and the administration, but with the Union providing the necessary work. The motion was carried unanimously. Jerry Baur reported that it would be impossible to ascend the chimney on the power plant in order to hang a banner up.

The President reported on his talk with Mr. Gunnell about the Soccer Club. Dick Hensel moved that the money set aside in

the budget for the Hobby Show (\$45.00) be used instead to provide expenses for the Soccer Club. The motion carried unanimously. It was decided that if the Union station wagons could be used for transportation, the Union would sponsor the Soccer Club under Team Activities.

Board meetings will continue to be held at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday evenings.


There is nothing definite on early enrollment for Board members.

The President asked that Board members prepare their reports in advance of the meetings so as to save time and needless discussion.



The eighth meeting of the 1951-52 Union Board was called to order by the President at 7:00 p.m., and the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. Mr. Smith and Mr. Bucher were absent.

Mr. Monfort read a request from Dorothy Cox and Bert Ziegler, ex-Arthur Murray instructors, who want to teach popular dancing as a Union-sponsored event. The Union would donate the space for such instructions, and the instructors would charge fifty cents (50¢) per one hour of instruction to cover their fees. The course would cover ten weeks. The Board withheld a decision pending further investigation by Jerry Wilson and Ed Frank, who will also report on the advisability of such a class being sponsored free by the Union.

Social - Two hundred and sixty-one couples attended the "First Fling", and the dance netted a profit of \$116.50.
