Union Board Meeting #4

Mike Moss called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m. Dee Benko read the minutes from the last meeting. They were corrected and then approved.

Mary Jo Nichols, Jim's new secretary, was introduced to the Board.

Mike then introduced Mr. Wook from the "Eclectic" magazine staff. Mr. Wood discussed the aims of the magazine and stated what the general content of the magazine would be: 1. Articles presenting student opinions regarding the administration and faculty. 2. Reflections of faculty and staff members. 3. Student's literary works. 4. Comprehensive summaries of significant lectures and meetings and 5. Shart papers on various subjects. Mr. Wood asked the Board to consider backing Eclectic magazine financially. Financial backing would involve about \$4,000 with the understanding that at least falf would be returned through sales and advertising. No action was taken by the Board at this time.

At this point each Union Board member was asked to make a report on the progress thus far with their various activities.

Jerry Pollock told the Board the the interviews for Junior Union Board were set for Wednesday, May 14th. In order to be eligible students must have 50 hours of Union work, a 1.4 average and either freshman or sophomore standing at this time. Out of the group of applicants, 12 will be chosen.

The publicity committee reported on their ideas for the clinic. These included suggestions for different events, experts to talk to Board, promotion of activities as a whole. In a few weeks the committee will present application forms to the Board.

Jim Lyons announced that card playing in the Commons will be limited when the cafeteria line is open. Discussion was held as to what to ask students to give in return for playing cards---i.e. I.D. card or a small fee which would be returned when the cards are returned.

Jim also distributed copies of the Union policies for Union Board use. Jim will take Board members on a tour of the Union Building on Monday at 3:00 p.m.

Various Board members designated which of their functions now have open applications.

Jundy Hinds announced her steering committee for Fall Carnival. Discussion arose as to one member not being qualified. The Board felt that in order to remove someone's name from a steering committee there must be majority vote to this effect. In this case, the majority did not so vote. Therefore, the Fall Carnival Steering Committee for next Fall is as follows:

Dave Klemm suggested that the Union booth be in a better location this year for Fall Carnival.
