Suggestions were made for the selection committee—that candidates have a central place to call and find out who was selected. It was also suggested that a personal interview be held between the President and each new member before the divisions are assigned. It was felt that each old Board Member should have an interview with his successor. Board Members thought the perhaps we were given too much printed material during the course of our term. It was mentioned that Jim Lyons and Mr. Jordan could give a resume of the financial part of the Union.

Jim Lyons said that a problem is existing with the renting of the Frangipani Room to outside groups. These groups have had alcoholic beverages at their dances. It was suggested that, if organizations are found to be violating University regulations, their names should be turned over to the Dean of Students. It was decided that our responsibility is to the decorum of the building and to the University regulations, but we cannot punish in fractions.

Jim also mentioned a problem of misuse of the guest room area. He asked for any possible suggestions from the Board Members.

Don asked for suggestions for the names of new lounges in the Union.

The meeting was adjourned.

- (5) Encourage applicants to work together
