In connection with the safety Council, Tom suggested that they have a budget since they do need to buy various things. Tom asked the Board to consider if we should continue the Awards Banquet and, if so, should it be revised. Also, we should consider possible ways of revising the hours system.

House - Ann said that everything is going smoothly in her area. She is working on the Ride Board now.

Social - Bob presented the First Fling Steering Committee which read as follows:

September 12, 1960 Union Board Meeting #5

The meeting was called to order by the President, Ray Muston, at 3:30 P.M. in the Union Board Room.

The new Assistant Program Director, Mrs. Johnson, was introduced to the Board. Mr. Don Oden, her predecessor, was given a "farewell gift" of an attache case during the summer.

Board members are to tell Katharine where and when they plan to have their interviews for committee chairmen.

Marilyn Mignin reported on the Open House and Student Activities Night which will be held Wednesday, September 14, at 8:00 P.M. in Alumni Hall. Thirty different activities will be exhibited. Each organization will have a table and may pass out folders and sign up members. The Union Board display boards used for the Summer Open House will be used again.

Copies of the Rifle Club Constitution have been placed in all Board members mailboxes. Arrangements are being made to help the club start functioning.

Norm Traeger announced that Jim Russ, formerly Fall Carnival Coordinator, has been appointed General Chairman of All Carnival in place of Phil Fine. One of the new prefab booths has been set up on the stage of Alumni Hall and seems to be very good. Five people should be able to set it up in 12 hours. Orders are to be taken Wednesday. Norm asked that Union Board members talk up the fact that prefab booths will take less time and so help both pledges' and actives' grades. A "Bachelor Bounce" is being considered in connection with the Bachelor of the Year Contest. Norm asked if anyone had a suggestion for a replacement for George Jacobson who was Bachelor of the Year Chairman. George is going elsewhere to school this year.

Bob Hanning reported on the First Fling. He said all publicity is out and things seem to be going well. Each student leader was given 5 tickets to sell. The Union Coupon Booklet will give students a 25% discount on a ticket.

A discussion was held concerning the policy for complimentary tickets. Bob Hanning moved that the Union Board give complimentary tickets to all Union functions. The motion was seconded by Marilyn Mignin. A complimentary ticket for each Board member's date will also be given. It was decided that the tickets must be used by the Board members, i.e., if a Union Board member accepts the tickets and then gives them away, the Union Board member must pay for them. In regard to Steering Committees, Jim Lyons suggested that whether or not they should receive complimentary tickets be discussed each time. Bob Hanning then moved that the First Fling Steering Committee receive complimentary tickets. The motion was seconded and passed.

Jim Lyons told the Board that the Fall student leaders will hand out Union Coupon Booklets on Wednesday morning of Orientation Week. Married students will also receive these, but they will be a slightly different color so Union Board can tell what the married students like and want.

Jim Lyons explained some of the improvements and changes that have been made in the Union. The Colonial Tea Room has been renamed Hoosier Den. From II:00 A.M. to I:30 P.M. the room will serve as commuters' lunch room. People who bring sack lunches may eat them here. In addition, the room can be used for dinner meetings. Last year's Board suggested that there be a menu in the Commons which would repeat itself each week. This suggestion has been carried out and the Commons now has an "ID Special". This entitles any student with an ID card to a 10% discount on this meal. There has been an increase in the food prices because of increases in labor, operation, etc. This ID Special will save the students money, particularly if they buy a meal ticket. They will then save 15% and this saving compensates completely for this year's higher prices. A new ride board is being made out of formica. It will be mounted on the wall next to the Beauty Shop. The Billiard Room is doing very well. It is now air conditioned. The increase in rates does not seem to have decreased the number of students using the room. The Browsing Room on the West end of the building is now open from 9:00 A.M. to II:00 P.M.

There are magazines and hometown newspapers in this room. The TV Room is adjacent to the Browsing Room. For the World Series, etc. the TV sets may be moved into the Browsing Room in order to accommodate more people. The Marine Room is now the Trophy Room. The Alumni Offices and Athletic Association have given trophys to be placed in this room. An official Hall of Fame will be started soon and Jim Lyons suggested that some recognition be given to the Olympic participants from Indiana University. Mrs. Rosemary Miller has taken Jack Weddle's position in the Craft Shop. Her assistant is John Howl. The Commons area has been expanded and the Bowling Alleys have been refinished. Mrs. Almy is now in Rhode Island. Jim Campbell and Mrs. Johnson have taken over Mrs. Almy's cultural activities. The reservation desks have been consolidated and food or room reservations can now be made across from the Barber Shop. The table tennis rates were higher this summer but this did not affect the number who used them. More people played this summer than last. The new tables should be repaired and new paddles are needed. There has been some question as to why there is an extra chair in the Barber Shop. Mr. Jordan explained that there must be a greater volume of customers in order to warrant another barber. The Beauty Shop has two full time operators and people are being interviewed for evening work. Work is being done on a room which is to be dedicated to the faculty and students who gave their lives in defense of our country during World Wars I and II.

Tom Smallwood asked about a new elevator. Mr. Lyons assured the Board that the elevator was safe in spite of the fact it was slow.

The Student Athletic Board has announced that 10 to 15 Union hours will be given for participation in the Card Section although it is no longer part of the Union's activities. It was suggested that a representative be selected by Union Board to take attendance in the Card Section and thereby check on each person's hours. Non traeger moved that Union Board cooperated with Student Athletic Board by giving 10 hours to card section participants for the 1960 football season only. The motion was seconded and passed.

Ray Muston said that the tentative date for the Weekly Board Meeting be Tuesday at 3:45 P.M. The Board members were asked to try to arrange their schedules according
