The Fall Carnival Steering Committee would again like to request permission to sell Late-Hours passes, giving coeds an extension of hours until 1:30 A.M. on the night of Fall Carnival, November 12, 1960. In past years this aspect of Carnival has proved to be a most effective way of raising money for Charity. Last year this booth alone grossed over \$1,400. Translated into food purchases, just the sales of Late-Hour passes sent over seventeen and a half tons of surplus foodstuff to families in distress.

We believe that the Late-Hour privileges will be especially appreciated this year, since we are planning to present the Carnival awards on the evening of Carnival itself, rather than at a special banquet the following day, as has been the custom previously. This will keep people at Carnival until nearly midnight, and without the privilege of extended hours, the members of the winning housing units would have no time to get together. This year the Commons will be open for all food services and dancing until 1:30 A.M. to provide a place for students to congregate.

The Steering Committee will greatly appreciate your giving utmost consideration to our request. We think this is a great opportunity for the women of AWS to make their contribution to charity, not only by granting Late-Hour privileges but also by participating in their sales.
