MINUTES

Oct. 20, 1981

The meeting was called to order at 5:50 p.m. after the Arbutus pictures were taken. Phil Chamberlin, Sara McNabb & Mr. Blackburn were excused. Leo Miller was absent, unexcused. Non-voting members present were Ann Claussen and Don Luse.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA: Agenda was approved without correction.

ADDITIONS & CORRECTIONS TO THE MINUTES: The correction to Chris Holobek's report should read \$98.70, not \$89.70. Under the Reunion Committee report, Milton Fineberg will award the scholarships, not Dean Weigand.

UNION BOARD AWARD: Donna Vogel received the award for her work with the Beach Party.

STAFF REPORTS: PROGRAM COORDINATOR: Ann Claussen reported there will be a new work-study person helping Deanie. Everyone should get November calendar information to Deanie this week. On Nov. 5, 6 & 7, the Conference Bureau will be using the committee room, 23-24. If you have any sign-up sheets for events, please prepare them and get them to Deanie.

ASST DIR. PROGRAM SERVICES: Don Luse explained the Union Board scholarships and reminded everyone that the deadline is Oct. 26.

Learning at Leisure: Diane Vogel reported she will have her next committee meeting Wednesday at 6 p.m.

Kiva: Beth Loeb reported that Tony O'Connor is working on the Kiva for Dusk 'til Dawn, Oct. 23 & 24. Friday, Janis Hunt will perform folk music, and David Jennings will perform soul, rhythm and blues. Saturday will be "Jazz Night". Performers will be Tim Riggins and his Jazz Quintet, and Robin Welch and Craig Small.

Travel & Excursions: David Francis reported the Canoe Trip is not selling as well as was expected. There's lots of enthusiasm and many people say they'll sign up, but not too many have. Registration will go on until Thursday morning, when a decision whether to cancel or not will be made. Volunteer Jam tickets are being bought. The next meeting will be Thursday at 6:30 p.m.

Films: Brian Fox reported attendance last week was 2133, and the profit was \$710.90. The 7 p.m. showing of Black Stallion on Wed. is cancelled due to a conflict with the Conference Bureau. The schedule for the Spring semester is finished and the films are being booked now.
