

Conductor **David Neely** maintains a busy career in concert and opera alongside an active teaching schedule. Music director and principal conductor of Des Moines Metro Opera since 2012, he has elevated the 46-year-old company's musical profile with acclaimed performances of a broad range of repertoire, including *Turandot*, *Falstaff*, *Elektra*, *Peter Grimes*, *Jenůfa*, *Don Giovanni*, *Dialogues of the Carmelites*, *La Fanciulla del West*, and

Flight. He has garnered critical acclaim for his work in such publications as the Chicago Tribune, Opera News, and Opera Today. His televised Manon and Billy Budd for Iowa Public Television both received Emmy awards. On the international scene, Neely has appeared with the Bochumer Symphoniker, Dortmunder Philharmoniker, and Symphonieorchester Vorarlberg, and has performed in numerous European opera houses, including Bonn, Dortmund, Halle, and St. Gallen. He has been a frequent guest conductor for concerts and operas at the Jacobs School of Music. Past appearances at Jacobs include *Dead Man Walking*, Florencia en el Amazonas, It's a Wonderful Life, and West Side Story. Since fall 2018, he has held the post of visiting associate professor in orchestral conducting at the school. He recently conducted Francesca Zambello's West Side Story with Atlanta Opera and D'Albert's Tielfand with Sarasota Opera. Upcoming appearances include subscription concerts with the Memphis Symphony Orchestra, as well as Wozzeck and Candide in Des Moines. Neely headed orchestral activities at the University of Kansas for nine years, where he brought distinction and visibility to the program. In 2016, he was named artist-educator of the year by the Kansas Federation of Music Clubs. Neely earned degrees in piano performance and orchestral conducting from Indiana University, where his teachers included Leonard Hokanson and Thomas Baldner. He received post-graduate instruction in orchestral conducting at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music under Gerhard Samuel.



Cellist **Peter Lockman** began his music career at age four, performing in his family's Irish music band in eastern Pennsylvania. He continued to perform throughout the Philadelphia area and twice collaboratively won the SATORI Chamber Music Competition. While a student at DePauw University, he performed in Germany, Austria, England, and at the White House, was a finalist in the DePauw Concerto Competition three

consecutive years, and was a member of the Asbury Quartet, DePauw's most prestigious ensemble. Looking to explore music outside the classical tradition he participated in the Silk Road Ensemble's Global Musician Workshop, performing with renowned musicians from around the world. In February 2017, he performed alongside members of the Philadelphia Orchestra and the Berlin and New York Philharmonic Orchestras at Carnegie Hall as a part of Music for Life International, a charity organization providing free eye surgery in developing countries. He recently traveled with fellow Jacobs students and faculty to Seoul, Korea, to perform with the students of Korea National University of Arts. Lockman is currently pursuing his Master of Music in Cello Performance at the Jacobs School of Music, where he studies with Eric Kim and has acted as principal cellist of four orchestras. His former teachers include Eric Edberg and Deborah Davis.
