Arthur Fagen has been professor of orchestral conducting at the Jacobs School of Music since 2008. Additionally, he has been music director of the Atlanta Opera since 2010. He has conducted opera productions at the world's most prestigious opera houses and music festivals. From 1998 to 2001, he was invited regularly as guest conductor at the Vienna State Opera,

in addition to performances at the Metropolitan Opera, Staatsoper Berlin Deutsche Oper Berlin, Munich State Opera, and many more. On the concert podium, he has appeared with numerous internationally known orchestras. Fagen has an opera repertory of more than 75 works. He has served as principal conductor in Kassel and Brunswick, as chief conductor of the Flanders Opera of Antwerp and Ghent, as music director of the Queens Symphony Orchestra, and as a member of the conducting staff of Lyric Opera of Chicago. From 2002 to 2007, he was music director of the Dortmund Philharmonic Orchestra and the Dortmund Opera. He and the Dortmund Philharmonic were invited to the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, the Palais de Beaux Arts in Brussels, and to Salzburg, Beijing, and Shanghai. Fagen conducted a new production of *Turandot* at the Atlanta Opera in 2007, opening the season and inaugurating the new opera house, the Cobb Energy Performing Arts Center. He was a regular guest conductor of the Munich Radio Orchestra and guest conducted the Orchestre de la Suisse Romande, Deutsche Kammerphilharmonie, Schleswig-Holstein Festival, and many others. He was first-prize winner of the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra Conductors Competition as well as a prize winner of the Gino Marinuzzi International Conductors' Competition in Italy. Fagen has recorded for BMG, Bayerischer Rundfunk, SFB, and WDR Cologne. He records regularly for Naxos, for which he has completed the six symphonies of Bohuslav Martinů. His Naxos recording of Martinu's piano concertos was awarded an Editor's Choice award in the March 2010 issue of Gramophone magazine.



Betsy Burleigh, Thomas R Kasdorf Professor of Choral Conducting and chair of the Choral Conducting Department at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music since the fall of 2013, served as music director of the Mendelssohn Choir of Pittsburgh from 2006 to 2015. She led the Mendelssohn Choir in performances of Brahms' Requiem, Bach's B-Minor Mass,

Rachmaninoff's Vespers, and Mozart's Great Mass in C Minor and prepared the choir for numerous performances with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra (PSO). As a guest conductor, Burleigh has led the PSO, Rhode Island Philharmonic, Akron Symphony, and Canton Symphony. Theater engagements have included music direction at Opera Cleveland and the Cleveland Public Theater. In March 2016, she prepared the Tanglewood Festival Chorus for a performance with the Boston Symphony Orchestra and music director Andris Nelsons. Acclaimed for her oratorio conducting, Burleigh's 2012 Chorus pro Musica performance of Haydn's *Creation* was praised in *The Boston Globe* as an

"expansive, poetic reading" and in *The Boston Phoenix* as "a stirring and elegant, lilting and expansive performance." Her 2010 rendition of Orff's *Carmina Burana* was praised as being both "nuanced" and "hair-raising" by *The Boston Musical Intelligencer*. She won the 2000 Northern Ohio Live Achievement Award for best classical/opera performance for Ulmann's *Der Kaiser von Atlantis* with the Cleveland Public Theatre and conducted the Cleveland Orchestra Chorus on an Emmy Award—winning concert for the 9/11 Red Cross Disaster Relief Fund. Soprano **Tiffany Choe**, a Korean American soprano born and raised in Southern California, is pursuing a Performer Diploma at the Jacobs School of Music under the tutelage of Heidi Grant Murphy. She is a recipient of the Georgina Joshi Fellowship for the 2021-22 school year. With the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions, she was an Encouragement Award

winner in the Western Region earlier this year, winner of the district region in Indianapolis in 2020, and an Encouragement Award winner in the Southeast Region in 2019. Most recently, Choe was seen as Mimì in the IU Jacobs School of Music Opera Theater production of *La Bohème*. With Jacobs Opera Theater, she has also performed as Susanna in *The Marriage of Figaro*, as Constance in *Dialogues of the Carmelites*, Rosalia in *West Side Story*, and Laoula in *L'Étoile*. She attended Ravinia's Steans Music Institute as a fellow this past summer.



Jiajun "David" Lai is a first-year doctoral student and associate instructor at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, where he studies with Norman Krieger. Blind from birth, Lai started lessons at age four in his hometown of Hangzhou, China. In 2005, with the assistance of renowned Chinese pianist and pedagogue Guangren Zhou, he moved to Beijing with his

family and began studying with Dongli Mao. He graduated from Beijing's Central Conservatory of Music (CCOM) high school in 2015 and from CCOM with a B.A. in Piano Performance in 2019. He earned an M.M. in Piano Performance from the University of Cincinnati College—Conservatory of Music, where he studied with Michael Chertock, in 2021. In 2018, he attended the Brevard Music Center Summer Music Festival and was also featured at the WQXR Young Artists Showcase. Last year, he won second place and was honored as "audience favorite" at the Boulder Bach Festival World Bach Competition.


