Thomas Wilkins is principal conductor of the Hollywood Bowl Orchestra, and Germeshausen Family and Youth Concert Conductor Chair with the Boston Symphony, as well as professor of music (conducting) at the Jacobs School of Music, where he holds the Henry A. Upper Chair of Orchestral Conducting established by the late Barbara and David Jacobs as a part of Indiana University's Matching the Promise Campaign. He is

also Music Director Laureate of the Omaha Symphony, where he was music director from 2005 through 2021. Past positions have included resident conductor of the Detroit Symphony and the Florida Orchestra (Tampa Bay), and associate conductor of the Richmond (Virginia) Symphony. He also has served on the music faculties of North Park University (Chicago), University of Tennessee in Chattanooga, and Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond. Devoted to promoting a life-long enthusiasm for music, Wilkins brings energy and commitment to audiences of all ages. He is hailed as a master at communicating and connecting with audiences. He has guest conducted orchestras throughout the United States. Wilkins' commitment to community has been demonstrated by his participation on several boards of directors, including the Greater Omaha Chamber of Commerce, the Charles Drew Health Center (Omaha), the Center Against Spouse Abuse in Tampa Bay, and the Museum of Fine Arts as well as the Academy Preparatory Center both in St. Petersburg, Florida. Currently he serves as chairman of the board for the Raymond James Charitable Endowment Fund and as National Ambassador for the non-profit World Pediatric Project, headquartered in Richmond, Virginia, which provides children throughout Central America and the Caribbean with critical surgical and diagnostic care. A native of Norfolk, Virginia, Wilkins is a graduate of the Shenandoah Conservatory of Music and the New England Conservatory of Music (Boston). Twenty-five-year-old **Prudence Hiu-Ying Poon**, from Hong Kong, has studied piano since age three. At age 10, she made her first orchestral debut with the Hong Kong Metropolitan Youth Orchestra. She has been keenly participating in competitions and festivals and was awarded prizes in numerous competitions, such as the Thomas & Evon Cooper International Competition and the New York International Piano

Competition. In 2022, she was awarded honorable mention and the Audience Prize in the 70th Wideman International Piano Competition and Piano Division Runner Up in the Naftzger Young Artists Auditions & Awards. She has also received prestigious awards and scholarships from such organizations as The Bernard Van Zuiden Music Fund and the Tan Family Foundation. In addition to her studies with Nancy Loo and Wan Yim in Hong Kong, Poon has been fortunate to work with such renowned pianists as Gary Graffman, Lang Lang, Peter Frankl, Stanislav Ioudenitch, and Pascal Roge, among others. She earned her Bachelor of Music degree in Piano Performance and Vocal Accompanying at Oberlin Conservatory under the tutelage of Robert Shannon and Philip Highfill. As a Dean's Scholarship recipient, she earned a Master of Music degree from New England Conservatory, where she studied with HaeSun Paik. Poon is currently pursuing a Doctor of Music degree in Music Literature and Piano Performance with a minor in Music Education at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music in the studio of Roberto Plano. At Jacobs, she serves as associate instructor and program assistant of the Secondary Piano Program.
